

No Phones in Changing Rooms Policy

Guildford City Swimming Club — in association with Swim England's Wavepower

Guildford City Swimming Club (GCSC) is committed to protecting the privacy, dignity and safety of every member while they are changing. This policy sets out a clear, zero-exception rule on mobile phones and recording devices in changing areas, and the consequences of breaching it. It should be read alongside GCSC's Photography and Social Media Policy and Welfare and Safeguarding policy.

The policy

- Mobile phones, smartwatches, tablets, cameras and any other device capable of taking a photograph, video or audio recording must not be taken into, or used in, changing rooms, toilets or other private changing areas at any GCSC training session, competition or Club event.
- This applies at all times, without exception, to everyone — swimmers, parents/carers, coaches, teachers, volunteers, officials and visitors.
- Devices should be left with a parent/carer, in a locker, or stored securely outside the changing area (for example, in a bag left with kit at poolside) before entering.
- Where a member has a genuine medical reason to carry a device (for example, for a health monitoring app), this should be agreed in advance with the Club Welfare Officer, and the device used only for that purpose.

Responsibilities

- Parents/carers should remind their child of this rule before each session, and should not themselves use a phone in a changing area at any time, including when assisting a young child to change.
- Coaches, teachers, officials and volunteers should reinforce this rule, challenge any breach they see, and must never use a device in a changing area themselves.
- Anyone who sees a phone or recording device being used in a changing area should report it immediately to a coach, official, or the Club Welfare Officer — it should not be ignored, however minor it may seem.

Breach of this policy

Any breach of this policy will be treated seriously and dealt with under GCSC's Disciplinary Policy and Codes of Conduct. Depending on the circumstances, this may include:

1. A verbal warning and immediate requirement to put the device away
2. A written warning recorded on file, and a meeting with the individual (and their parent/carer, if under 18)
3. Temporary suspension from training sessions, competitions or Club events
4. Removal of membership or role within the Club in serious or repeated cases
5. Referral to the police, where a criminal offence is suspected

Any sanction will be proportionate to the circumstances, and applied with regard to the age and understanding of those involved.

If an indecent or inappropriate image is suspected

Taking, making, sharing, uploading or possessing an indecent image of a child is a criminal offence.

If you suspect a device has been used to take an inappropriate image in a changing area, report it immediately to the Club Welfare Officer and the Police. Do not view, forward, or attempt to investigate the image yourself.
